DEPARTMENT RULES

1. DELIVERY:

- Entry forms and bottles are to be delivered together.
- Bottles with entry forms and fees may be shipped or hand-delivered to Brewmaster only. Bottles with entry forms and fees **MUST BE** hand-delivered to all other locations.
- Deliver bottles with entry forms and fees to Fairgrounds on May 5th only. **No entries** will be accepted after May 5th.

It is not against any Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms regulations or federal laws to ship your entries via privately owned shipping company for analytical purposes. It is illegal, however, to ship alcoholic beverages via the United States Postal Services.

2. LIMITATIONS:

- Competition is open to all homebrewers over **21 years of age on May 5th, 2007**. Each household is limited to six beer and six wine entries, no more than one entry per class.
- Fair Management and/or judges may combine entries for the proposed judging.

3. BOTTLING:

- Each exhibitor must submit a minimum of **THREE** clean, unmarked bottles which are free of any identifying markings, 12 oz bottles only. Due to the inconvenience of handling, no other bottles will be accepted. NIP bottles (6 oz– 8 oz) will be accepted in the strong ale, mead, and barley wine categories.
- Each bottle must have a label affixed by a rubber band with entrant name, division, class (spelled out), club, and any fruit, spices, or special or unusual ingredients.

- c. Special attention should be given to the category and style designations so that your brew will be entered and judged according to the proper style. PLEASE review the BJCP style guidelines at www.BJCP.org.

- d. Each entry qualifies for the label competition, DIVISION 415. To enter the label competition, enter a fourth empty bottle with (1) glued label for judging and (2) an entry label affixed by a rubber band with entrant name, division, and class (spelled out). See DIVISION 415 for details.
- e. The competition organizer reserves the right to refuse or disqualify any entries not meeting the above guidelines or to consolidate classes, if warranted, due to low numbers of entries in a class.
- f. Entries become the property of the Alameda County Fair and will not be returned.
4. **JUDGING:** The Homebrew competition uses the American system of judging. This judging ranks beers against one another and awards one first place, on second place, etc. for each Division. Judges will be experienced and BJCP Certified. Judges' decision is final. Judging will be closed to the exhibitors. Results will not be given by phone.
5. **DISPLAY:** Homebrew will be displayed in the Agriculture Building for the duration of the Fair.
6. **AWARDS:**
- a. Special rosettes awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each division.
 - b. Additional prizes will be awarded for 1st in divisions 405 – 412, along with Best of Show and Reserve Best of Show.
 - c. Results will not be given over the phone, or before opening day of the Fair. Awards and score sheets will be mailed after the Fair is over.

DIVISION 415 – LABEL Limit One Label Per Class Per Exhibitor 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place rosette per class

Every homebrew entry (DIVISIONS 405 – 412 above) qualifies for entry in the homebrew label competition.

1. **DELIVERY:** To enter the label competition, enter a fourth, empty bottle with:
 - a) glued label for judging and
 - b) an entry label affixed by a rubber band with entrant name, division and class (spelled out).
2. **JUDGING:** Labels must reflect good taste. Labels will be judged in two classes. Judging criteria will be based on an exhibitor’s creativity and originality. Judges will be looking for an “attention grabber” that elicits further investigation based on the use of color, design, and composition. Judges’ decision is final. Judging will be closed to the exhibitors.
3. **DISPLAY:** Homebrew labels will be displayed in the Agriculture Building for the duration of the Fair.
4. **AWARDS:**
 - a) Special rosettes awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each division
 - b) Results will not be given over the phone, or before opening day of the Fair. Awards and score sheets will be mailed after the Fair is over.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. DELIVERY:

- Entries **MAY NOT** be shipped. Entries **MUST BE** hand-delivered to all locations.
- Deliver to Fairgrounds only. **NO entries will be accepted after June 17.**

1. LIMITATIONS:

- Competition is open to all California amateur winemakers over **21 years of age on May 13, 2006.**
- An amateur winemaker chooses winemaking as a hobby. The amateur winemaker will not have a degree in enology, work in a winery in a winemaking capacity, and no part of his/her livelihood is derived from commercial wine production.
- Each exhibitor is limited to six wine entries, no more than two per class.
- Fair management and/or judges may reclassify entries.
- Lot size may not exceed 200 gallons of production.
- A varietal must consist of 75% of the named grape. A blend is less than 75% of a particular varietal.

10. BOTTLING:

- Wines are to be bottled and labeled in 750 milliliter or one quart size bottles.

- b. Exhibitors must bring **TWO** bottles of each wine variety entered. Each bottle must have a label affixed to it with exhibitor's name, variety, division and class. The tasted bottle will be disposed of; the other will be displayed during the Fair. Display bottles will only be returned if the request is made on the entry form.
- 4. The Alameda County Fair Association, or its representatives, retains the right to refuse or disqualify any entries that do not meet the specifications of the rules of competition.

AMATUER WINEMAKING

- 5. **JUDGING:** Judges' decision is final. Judging will be closed to the exhibitors. No results will be given by phone.
- 6. **DISPLAY:** Amateur Wine will be displayed in the Wine Garden. Following the Fair, wine entries may be picked up at the Exhibit Office Tuesday, July 11th from 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.
- 7. **AWARDS:**
 - d. Each exhibitor is limited to two cash awards per class.
 - e. Results will not be given over the phone or before opening day of the Fair.
